HELPING YOUR CHILDREN in SCHOOL

Tip #1: Focus on Homework.

For each subject, whether your children have been given homework or not, make sure they review their notes. This will mean that when a big test or an end of unit test comes up, they will be prepared to study for it. Focusing on homework will also help your children be

ready for the next lesson, and ready to ask any questions that might have come up.

Tip #2: Keep your notes neat and clear.

While your children are applying Tip # 1, they can "kill two birds with one stone" by improving the quality of their notes. Make sure

your children's' notes contain all the information they need to know. Have them highlight or underline the most important points. Notes full of crossed out words and messy ink patches need to be rewritten altogether.

Tip #3: Keep your schoolbag neat.

amazed by what they might find! Often, some "lost" notes or homework will show up just in time. For this reason, it is best to have your children do this in the middle of the week, Wednesday night is best. After a little while, your children will become naturally neater.

Tip #4: Use your time efficiently.

If your children get stuck on a particular piece of homework, have them leave it and move on to the next piece. Otherwise, their frustration will rise and make matters worse. Have your children go back to the piece they left after a while. Things might be clearer then.

Tip #5: Always look ahead.

Your children should use their school planners or their own schedules to antici-

Tip #6: Do research wisely.

If research is involved in a project, be careful about how your children use the Internet. The Internet is a valuable resource, but it can be very distracting. Your children might get sidetracked and waste time going from topic to topic.

Every now and then, take your children to the library to do their research. They will find valuable information and learn many useful research skills.

Tip #7: Use technology.

Help your children learn to use a computer effectively to apply to their schoolwork. Let them experiment with Power-Point, Publisher,
Front Page, and other programs. Help your children learn to type efficiently and use Word correctly. Install appropriate audio books on their iPods and watch the Discovery Channel and other educational television programs with them.

Tip #8: Find your way. This is going to

be trial and error at the beginning, but for any subject



and homework assignment, your children will have to find what works best for them. If positive results are not occurring, there is something they are not doing right. Some children may have to rewrite their notes to remember facts, others might have to read them aloud, while still others might need to act them out or build something. Once the right way is found, learning will improve.

Tip #9: Prioritize what must be done.

Your children must learn to prioritize the things they need to do. Schoolwork and extracurricular activities must come first. Make this very clear to your children and help them stick to this priority.

Tip #10: Communicate with teachers.

This applies to you as parents as well as to your children. If there is any doubt about an assignment, contact the teacher. Encourage your children to ask the teacher if they find something to be unclear. day. Doing this will also help your children develop important communication skills and build their self-confidence.

PASSING on HEALTHY HABITS to YOUR CHILDREN

- Make it clear your children are not allowed to smoke cigarettes, chew tobacco, drink alcohol or use other drugs. Establish clear consequences if these rules are broken.
- Explain why these substances are harmful. Encourage them to ask questions. A true story may get your children's attention more effec-
- tively than facts and statistics alone. Give real-life examples of people who have experienced negative consequences from using alcohol, tobacco or other drugs.
- Talk to your children about peer pressure. Role-playing can prepare them to say no if they are offered cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, alcohol or other drugs.
- Know your children's friends and their friends' parents. Always ask your kids where they're going, what they're doing, who will be there, when they will return and how you can reach them. Let other parents know the rules you expect your children to follow.
- Set a good example. Pay attention to how your behaviors may affect your children.

THE TEN HABITS of SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

Successful students have good study habits. They apply these habits to all of their classes. Read about each study habit. Work to develop any study habit you do not have.

1. Try not to do too much studying at one time

If you try to do too much studying at one time, you will tire and your studying will not be very effective. Space the work you have to do over shorter periods of time. Taking short breaks will restore your mental energy.

2. Plan specific times for studying.

Study time is any time you are doing something related to schoolwork. It can be completing assigned reading, working on a paper or project, or studying for a test. Schedule specific times through-

out the week for your study time.

3. Try to study at the same times each day.

Studying at the same times each day establishes a routine that becomes a regular part of your life, just like sleeping and eating. When a scheduled study time comes up during the day, you will be mentally prepared to begin studying. of your life, just like sleeping

4. Set specific goals for their study times.

Goals will help you stay focused and monitor your progress. Simply sitting down to study has little value. You must be very clear about what you want to accomplish during your study times.

5. Start studying when planned.

You may delay starting your studying because you don't like an assignment or think it is too hard. A delay in studying is called "procrastination." If you procrastinate for any reason, you will find it difficult to get everything done when you need to. You may rush to make up the time you wasted getting started, resulting in

careless work and errors.

6. Work on the assignment they find most difficult first.

Your most difficult assignment will require the most effort. Start with your most difficult assignment since this is when you have the most mental energy.

7. Review their notes before beginning an assignment.

Reviewing your notes can help you make sure you are doing an assignment correctly. Also, your notes may include information that will help you complete an assignment.

8.Tell their friends not to call them during their study times.

Two study problems can occur if your friends call you during your study times. First, your

work is interrupted. It is not that easy to get back to what you were doing. Second, your friends may talk about things that will distract you from what you need to do. Here's a simple idea - turn off your cell phone during your study times.

9. Call another student when they have difficulty with an assignment. This is a case where "two heads may be better than one."

10. Review their schoolwork over the weekend.

Yes, weekends should be fun time. But there is also time to do some review. This will help you be ready to go on Monday morning when another school week begins.



THE I.I.S. BENEYOUENT TABLE (BAKE SALE)



The students and teachers participated in the evacuation process under the supervision and follow up of the schools principal and B.O.D. The process was executed by the principal making an illusive phone call to the civil defense department to inform them that an earthquake and serious injuries occurred at the school at the same time the school warning bell rang. The evacuation process that was arranged by the civil defense department was to exit the school within minutes was automatically executed. The injured individuals were sent to the hospital the schools doctor, security and safety teams all helped the civil defense team in exiting the 800 students and teacher out of the school. The schools principal reassured that the evacuation process was successful and the students' compliance and their following of the rules of the conscious execution process had a big role in the process being successful.





OHEWING GUM ACTIVITAES the BRAIN

Forget what your school tells you . Teachers have a 'thing' about chewing gum in class, they claim its distributing and prohibited. But they should think twice before telling us to spit it out again, because this what they didn't know:

Chewing gum improves your memory up to 28% and your

IQ up to 15 points. What happens is that the act of chewing speeds up vour heartbeat and blood pressure just enough to wake up both left and right hemispheres to get "in-sync", and to work together. It turns out that the chewing-action creates a bodily (mouth and jaw) rhythm which copies, so

that mind and body get into 'entertainment'. Chewing causes our hearts to pump more blood to our brain than it usually does and it also increases the glucose level, making the student more alert. Mental tasks are done 20% more effectively while chewing gum and that's why it makes it easier.

TO PROYE IT

The original research began in 2001 and made it to the majorleagues in the following year at the University of North Umbria in Great Britain. Dr. Scholey's team uses a group who chewed gum, a second that did not move their lips and jaws, and a third that had no gum, but pretended to chew by moving their jaws up-

and-down. The results were revealing. The aum chewers doubled the scores of those who did nothing but keep their jaws shut. The 'pretend' group improved but less that 25% of the 'gum chewers', but significantly compared to the 'normal' 9non-chewers) Preliminary research suggests that regular chewing can help you

chewing can help remember names, makes you thinner, whitens teeth, etc. Teachers may outlaw chewing gum in class makes kids smarter. So next time teaches orders you to throw out you gum, explain to her that it's actually good for you.


